

Reopening California

Effective **June 15, 2021**, California has begun to ease COVID-19 restrictions. Here are the updates you should know about: most* businesses are operating as normal which means **NO MASKS** (if fully vaccinated), **NO PHYSICAL DISTANCING, NO CAPACITY LIMITS** and **NO MORE COUNTY TIER SYSTEM**.

Masking is still required for everyone in specific situations, such as:

- Public transit
- Schools (K-12)
- Correctional facilities
- Healthcare / Long-term care facilities
- Homeless / Emergency shelters

Someone is considered fully vaccinated **two weeks or more** after their **second dose of Pfizer/Moderna** or **two weeks after** receiving the **single dose J&J vaccine**.

People who are **NOT** fully vaccinated must still wear masks in all indoor public settings and crowded outdoor settings.

* Excluded businesses include youth, healthcare and high-risk congregate settings.

MEGA EVENTS

California defines a mega event as any event that draws 5,000+ people indoors or 10,000+ people outdoors.

- Indoor spaces should be well ventilated (i.e., open all windows and doors to increase natural air flow), following current CDPH and CalOSHA guidance.
- Large scale indoor events will require patrons to be **vaccinated** or provide a **negative test** until **October 1, 2021**.

OSHA REQUIREMENTS FOR UNVACCINATED EMPLOYEES

- Identify opportunities to get vaccinated (vaccinations not required)
- Maintain social distance – at least 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths)
- Properly wear a face covering over your nose and mouth.
- Practice good personal hygiene and wash your hands often
- Monitor your health daily and be alert for COVID-19 symptoms (e.g., fever, cough, or shortness of breath)

SD COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER

- **Isolation & Quarantine still in place** for all persons not fully vaccinated OR are diagnosed with/likely to have COVID-19.
- Unvaccinated individuals should self-quarantine for a **minimum of 10 days and up to 14 days** after an exposure to prevent the spread and see if symptoms develop.
- ANY individual diagnosed with or likely to have COVID-19 must isolate
